Mr. Jack Nelson, of Decatur, Georgia (hereafter called "client") desires as much information as possible on a certain EDWARD NELSON, born circa 1690, who emigrated from England to Virginia in the period 1714 to 1718; of his family and more specifically of his grandson, PETER CARR NELSON, born in Hanover County, Virginia 1757 (died 1827).

Client states that family tradition and information indicates his lineal descent as follows (charted for easier comprehension): -

- I EDWARD NELSON, born ca 1690 Essex Co, England; settled in New Kent Co VA ca 1714-1718; married 1719 MARY GARLAND.
- II JAMES NELSON (eldest son; born ca 1724)
- III REV PETER CARR NELSON, b ca 1757; d 1827; m 1789 NANCY LAWRENCE: Episcopal priest for 20 years at Old Fork Church Hanover Co VA.
- IV DR ROBERT ANDREW NELSON, graduate of W & M and Univ of MD, removed to Mercer Co, Kentucky...
- V JOHN NELSON (grandfather of client)....

Client also wishes to explore, if possible, the records of a certain DABNEY CARR who married a sister of Thomas Jefferson and who had a son named Peter Carr, born 1770, for some possible degree of relationship.

NELSON FAMILY RECORDS

DISCUSSION:

In addition to the marriage records and other items quoted as references from "Tylers Quarterly" (supra) the best evidence and documentation found by this compiler concerning CAPTAIN EDWARD NELSON and client's direct line of descent is contained in "NELSON FAMILY RECORDS - HANOVER COUNTY, VA" which is at present in the safe custody of the VIRGINIA HISTORICAL SOCIETY, RICHMOND, VIRGINIA and an account of which has recently been rendered in the Virginia Genealogical Society Quarterly, Vol 16 (Jan 1978) pps 14 - 15 from which we now quote: -

- I "EDWARD NELSON, son of JAMES NELSON, ESQ., of ESSEX COUNTY, near London, England, was born 1790. His parents, dying while he was very young, was taken care of by an uncle. Having the acquaintance of a sea captain, the pictures of ocean adventures so dazzled his boyish imagination that he ran away from home, to sail with the Captain when he was only 14 years old. He followed the sea for 14 years, becoming the Captain of a vessel (from which he obtained his title of "Captain"). He came to Virginia and settled on Little River about 1718. (Note by compiler: this was in New Kent County in that portion which became Hanover County in 1720-21 when it was formed as a new county). He married 1719 MARY, daughter of EDWARD and JANE (JENNINGS) GARLAND and had issue: -

EDWARD GARLAND elected Church Wardens for the ensuing year (ibid, p 89) 3 July 1720 WHEREAS it has been a custom for every Church Warden to continue two years in office and MR. EDWARD GARLAND, who was Church Warden last year, being very ailing...it is ordered...etc

DISCUSSION:

A letter to Mrs. Charles E. Dille, 2601 Park Avenue, Cairo, Illinois, dated 1 August 1929 from Professor W. E. Dickinson, University of West Virginia, Morgantown, West VA, charts the HARRIS PEDIGREE as follows:

GEORGE HARRIS, baptized 13 Apr 1701 JOHN HARRIS, baptized 28 March 1703; married Miss (____) iv. **CLOUGH** BENJAMIN HARRIS, died 1765 v. vi. FREDERICK, born 1705 WILLIAM HARRIS JUNIOR, born 1707 - married HENRIETTA vii.. and had issue:

Professor Dickinson stated that Mrs. Virginia Armistead Garber, of Richmond, VA gave him the above "NELSON" data and also verified his Armistead Churchill data.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS OF POSSIBLE INTEREST:

Fothergill & Naugle, Virginia Taxpayers, page 92 -

PETER NELSON King & Queen County 1782 (himself and one slave)

COMMENT:

This may or may not be your ancestor, Rev Peter Nelson. However, in 1782 he was approximately 25 years of age and should appear as a taxable adult resident of some Virginia county. The above citation is the only "PETER" so listed.

Bishop William Meade, Old Churches, Ministers, and Families of Virginia, Vol. I, page 420 -

...In the year 1789 the REV PETER NELSON, of the same name, though of a different family, from those who formed a part of his congregation, was the minister of St Martin's and the Rev Mr. Talley was minister of St Paul's. MR NELSON, according to the journal, was (still) minister in 1799 and sometime after that united himself to the Baptist Church...

E. G. & P. G. Glazebrook, "Hanover Migrations (Virginia Migrations), Introduction page iii [See further]

John Boswell was born 14 September 1771; died 1815. It is believed that he attended the classical school conducted by the REV. PETER NELSON...etc... His brother, Chapman Johnson, born 15 March 1779, Louisa County, studied for two years at the classical school conducted by the REV PETER NELSON, probably at "Wingfield" on the Little River in Hanover County...etc...

ABSENTEE LANDOWNERS - 1814

PETER NELSON 970 acres Hanover Co Present Residence CAROLINE COUNTY

COMMENT: The clerk has a marginal note that 297 acres was conveyed to J. Thornton which means he had a total of 1267 acres in this tract at one time. I have been unable to find any further records of Rev Peter in either King & Queen or in Caroline County which are lost record counties. In the above record the clerk further identifies the 970 acre tract as being 17 miles west of the courthouse and adjoining lands of WILLIAM NELSON and ROBERT HONEYMAN... Also, of interest is an item found in Edward Pleasants Valentine, Valentine Papers, Vol I, p 69 - "Will of Izard Bacon, of Henrico County, VA, dated 23 December 1815 in which (among other legatees) he bequeaths ₹ 15 "TO MY FRIEND, MR. NELSON, SCHOOLMASTER".

DISCUSSION:

As can be readily seen, Dabney Carr was only 14 years older than Rev Peter Carr Nelson. It is certainly possible that Dabney and Rev Peter were of some degree of relationship but if so it could not have been through a marriage connections between the "Carrs" and the "Nelsons". It would have to be thru a maternal line, probably the "OVERTON" line connected with the "HARRIS" line (See Harris Excursus, page ____ this report). There was not time enough to go into this SPECULATION further but it does seem to be an interesting possibility. If further pursuit in the future is undertaken it might be well to search for a hypothetical PETER CARR living in a generation earlier than 1757 (when Rev Peter Nelson was born).

[Handwritten note added here by (either) Charles Hughes Hamlin or Jack Lee Nelson: "See my research notes proving them 2nd cousins once removed, through Harris __ Overton & ?Garland line]

FURTHER DISCUSSION:

It seems very likely that client's immigrant ancestor, EDWARD NELSON (Gen I) must have been a mariner and Captain of a ship at one time. There is no evidence at all that he was a "SURGEON" [See below *] and it is very unlikely that he could have been one if he ran away to sea when he was age 14. The evidence we have at present is that he was born in Essex County, England, and was a son of JAMES NELSON, ESQ., of that place who died after 1690 and before 1704. To pursue this lineage further will require research in Essex County, England records and preferably Parish Records first for births, deaths, and marriages. These records would not be available in Virginia.

*[Jack Lee Nelson mentioned that according to books he has read on slavery, the Captain would often be required to examine the slaves as to their fitness, thus 'acquiring' a self-styled 'Surgeon' designation. See Sources # 8. See P 16/17 mlnj]

"Edward Nelson, son of James Nelson, of Essex County, England, was born A.D. 1690...one sister Elizabeth, older than himself, their parents dying when they were very young...resided with an uncle who lived in a small village near London...one Sunday morning, feigned sickness...succeeded in getting on board the vessel...only fourteen years of age...adventurous life of fourteen years...landed in Virginia and settled on Little River, in the county of Hanover, then called New Kent. During his voyage he had the misfortune to lose one of his eyes...The year after landing in Virginia he married Mary Garland, the second daughter of Edward and Jane Garland... Issue, among others, James Nelson, who married in 1750 Keziah Harris. Issue, among others, Peter Carr Nelson, who married, December 4, 1789, Nancy Lawrence. Issue, among others, James Henry Nelson, who moved to Holly Springs, Miss., and married, November 26, 1840, Maria Courtney Goodrich (James). Issue, among others, William Cowper Nelson, who married, March 26, 1867, at Centenary Church, Richmond, Va. Mary Louisa Armistead, Daughter of Robert A. Armistead and Martha Anne Savage, of Hampton, Va. Issue: Martha Armistead Nelson; Maria Courtney Nelson, died June 17, 1871, Richmond, Va; James Henry Nelson, died September 4, 1872, Nashville, Tenn.l William Clarence Nelson, died May 14, 1876, Nashville, Tenn.; Mary Louise Nelson; Robert Armistead Nelson; Virginia Garber Nelson; Kinlock Falconer Nelson, died July 9, 1885, Nashville, Tenn.; Wilbur Armistead Nelson.

"Rev. Peter Carr Nelson, born 1757, was rector of St Mattins [sic] Parish, Hanover County, Va., in 1789. According to Bishop Meade's Old Families of Virginia he was still rector of the parish in 1799, and was pastor of the Old Fork Church in 1808 or 1809 according to Dr. Jeter's Baptist Ministers of Virginia. He was baptized by immersion, together with his wife, and connected

"himself with the Baptist Church. He died February 15, 1827, and was buried at the Old Fork Church by the side of his wife, Nancy Lawrence, who died in May, 1814, in the forth-fifth year of her age.

"Rev. Peter Carr Nelson was educated by Mr. Anderson Bell, a Scotchman, who also educated the children of the Berkeleys and Pages. He entered William and Mary College (the University not then being endowed); graduated with great distinction. Soon after went to Philadelphia, took orders, and preached twenty years in the Old Fork Church (Episcopal), Hanover. He married Anne Lawrence, daughter of Mr. Edward Lawrence and Fannie Taylor, who was sister of Mr. Thomas Taylor, a prominent citizen of Richmond, Va., and first cousin to the Galts, Ellises, Harrisons"...
