To the Honorable the Speaker & Members of the House of Representatives
The petition of Thomas Nelson shewith that he is now nearly seventy two years of age.
That he was one among that number that stept forth in the vindication of the wrongs

done his country in the Revolutionary war & fought for _____. His services were mostly in this state. He ___ done duty under Capt Montgomery at perrysburgh This was early in the war. He was in the whole campaign called Sumpters round during which there was several engagements with the enemy to wit at the Congaree, at Horsepens at the Bluff & at Ratcliffs - He was out on a tour under Genl Sumpter, at Marshalls Mills & at Pearysburgh. Your Petitioner was often engaged in scouting parties & other camp duties. Indeed, he was little ___ from the duties of a soldier during the whole period that this state was endangered by the British & Tories. Your petitioner states that he always thought himself entitled to the character of a good soldier as he expects to show by certificates - five persons now remain by whom the services of your petitioner can be proven. Your Petitioner states that he is now old and to labor seems to advance his infirmities. In the service he experienced great hardship & bodily affliction from cold, hunger, & _____

If you in your wisdom & charity think him entitled to a pension, you relieve him in some degree from labor in his old age if nothing else, and ___ it would gratify him to know that he was though of as a _____ among the great number that have got pensions that never rendered half the _____ services to your country that _____ Petitioner has - & your Petitioner with Prayer s/ Thos Nelson
